How did they perform?





25% said turnover increased



27% said it stayed the same



42% said it decreased

However rural firms were more likely than urban firms to have generated a profit or surplus.



66% rural firms

How were they impacted?





37% of rural and



43% of urban firms

said that they had mainly experienced negative effects - suggesting rural businesses, overall, were slightly less affected.

Less than 5% said the support helped create new products or services or pivot to a new business plan.
