REPORT TO SENATE FROM PUBLIC LECTURES COMMITTEE 2023-24 Academic Year

The INSIGHTS Public Lectures and LIVE Music Concerts had another successful year of events in the 2023-24 academic year, attracting over 12,900 people/views to lectures and concerts. Please see Appendix 1 for a list of all concerts, lectures and debates from 2023-24.

The Public Lectures programme was overseen by two co-chairs, Dr Martin Farr and Professor Sally Shortall. They worked alongside the Public Lectures and Events Team, Umbereen Moir and Stefanie Moorhead. The LIVE Lunchtime Concerts were coordinated by Olivia Cameron.

Attendance/viewing figures

INSIGHTS Lectures

The total number of attendees/viewers for the 2023-24 INSIGHTS Public Lecture programme of 32 events was 8,646 [in person audiences + 7-day online views] with an average of 270 attendees/viewers per event. Lecture highlights included talks by Mark Galeotti (1,255 – this talk has been viewed more than 23,000 times online); Lord Robertson (543); and Pippa Crerar (535).

LIVE Concerts

The programme of Lunchtime Concerts received a total of 4,290 attendees over the academic year, with an average of 252 attendees over 17 concerts. The concerts remain consistently popular, with performances from The Willow Trio (325) and Andy Watt and Friends (310).

Both programmes have increased their total and average audiences from the previous academic year:

- The LIVE Concerts were regularly attended by groups from local primary schools.

2024-25 Academic Year : Mid-Year Update

Between October 2024 and January 2025 INSIGHTS Lectures were attended by 1,998 people, and recordings of events were watched 1,542 times: giving an average audience of 253 per event (for 14 events – there was also one lecture cancellation and one postponement). The most popular events were talks by Peter Kellner, Nik Money and Iwan Morgan. Pre-bookings remain in place for lectures via Eventbrite, and booking-attendee conversion rates remain high, averaging 70% per event [the conversion rates for free events is usually ~50%].

The Autumn LIVE Concerts were attended by 1,940 people, with an average audience of 216 people (for 9 events). Concerts by The Tyne Signature Barbershop Quartet and The Olivia Cuttill Quintet were the most popular with 275 and 285 people attending respectively.

Lectures and Concerts resumed in early February 2025 with a new season of events.

From Newcastle Podcast

The *From Newcastle* Podcast continues to perform well. In autumn 2024 episodes included a US election special and a series showcasing some of the successes of Newcastle University's startups and spin-out companies. Coming up in spring, we have a series on engineering at Newcastle University, a special episode to mark International Women's Day and a mini-series to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the Centre for Life. Newcastle Debates

Newcastle Debates resumed in October with the first of three debates this academic year, focussing on a safe North East for all. The theme of the debates scheduled this spring are: 1) access to education and employment and 2) economic empowerment.

Cost-cutting measures

INSIGHTS and Debates implemented cost-saving measures for the 2024-25 programmes, which included reducing print and postage costs, and reviewing hospitality arrangements. The INSIGHTS programme has reduced the number of events in 2024-25 and will be continuing this for forthcoming programmes. Moving forward there will be more one-lecture weeks, this allows us to have a regular offering without compromising the quality of the programme. Adjusting the programme in this way means we still have scope to add events if opportunities arise, and we can be responsive if needed, as well as being able to easily increase the programme again in the future.
