GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1. Applicants must be registered as home students on the MRes Cancer Programme at Newcastle University in the 2025-2026 academic year.
- 2. Award will be made after consideration of all relevant applications in competition.
- 3. Successful applicants will be chosen to receive the awards on the basis of academic ability as evaluated by consistent high achievement in examination, evidence of commitment to cancer research and the overall quality of the application.
- 4. Students who are funded from another source are not eligible to apply for these awards.
- 5. Applications must be submitted by e-mail on the application form attached. Other applications will not be accepted.
- 6. The deadline for applications for the 2025-2026 academic year is 10th February 2025.
- 7. Awards will not be confirmed unless applicants satisfy all conditions related to the scholarship offer.
- 8. The Centre reserves the right to vary all or any masters awards at its discretion.
- 9. At the end of the MRes Cancer Programme, recipients must submit to the Centre a brief report that summarises how the award has helped them with their studies and the University transcript of their degree.
- 10. If a student leaves the University before the end of the academic year or returns an unsatisfactory report, the Centre has the right to request that the award is refunded.

AWARD-SPECIFIC REGULATIONS

- 1. The Newcastle University Centre for Cancer CRUK Cancer Intercalating Bursaries are awarded to outstanding young medical students who study the MRes Cancer Programme during their intercalation year.
- 2. These Studentships are awarded on the basis of proven academic excellence in secondary and tertiary education.
- 3. Applicants are expected to demonstrate a strong commitment to continued involvement in cancer research.
- 4. Awardees must undertake their research project under the supervision of at least one academic within the Newcastle University Centre for Cancer.
- 5. Typically, up to two Newcastle University Centre for Cancer CRUK Cancer Intercalating Bursaries are available annually.
- 6. The deadline for applications for the 2025-2026 academic year is 10th February 2025.
- 7. Applications are subject to peer review and consideration by the CRUK Clinical Academic Training Programme leadership team.
- Each award is worth up to £6000 of which £3,000 is payable in two equal amounts across the academic year, directly to the awardee for use towards living expenses, and £3,000 is for consumable expenditure associated with the research project.
