SCOPE OF APPLICATIONS

The LLB, LLB (European Legal Studies), LLB (International Legal Studies) and LLB (with Placement Year) do not accept applications for RPL because these programmes aim to provide the student with a broad range of core subjects from the English legal system. Recognition of prior learning is inconsistent with this aim. For recognition of prior learning to be acceptable under this system, the institution at which the student has previously learned must follow the same aim, which can be very difficult to verify. We may, however, exceptionally consider applications for RPL on a case-by-case basis for LLB Stage 2, but only where the student's prior learning maps onto on to our LLB course accordingly.

What evidence will be required:

Transcripts showing level, credits and marks plus copies of syllabuses. Note that these must demonstrate that they map onto the Newcastle Law School LLB course.

Each applicant for RPL or credit transfer will be issued with the relevant module outline forms specifying learning outcomes and given an RPL/credit transfer application form.
